

WRCC MEETING MINUTES – MARCH 2013

Meeting called to order at 7:00 by Roger Burrigh.

Treasurer's Report was read and approved.

Minutes of last meeting were approved as posted on website.

No visitors were introduced.

Safety Officer made no report at this time.

Afton News: Mower battery was replaced, and repaired as needed for continued service at the field.

Chapin mower is due for repair/service, also.

Erosion at runway and taxiway areas needs to be repaired with fill-dirt and grass seed.

Brooks Middle School has requested the Club to perform at Jabara Airport on May 9th.

Martha Tregellas has arranged for the dedication of the runway at Chapin, and is working on a history of R/C modelling in Wichita.

WRCC Past President's Fun-Fly is scheduled for Saturday, April 13th, at Chapin Airpark.

Executive meeting was held at Spangle's on March 16th.

Discussion was made about the Club putting together a “kit” of a Dakota biplane, for purchase, made from sheet foam, and suitable for an electric motor.

Exploration Place is holding an event in June, that the Club may be interested in attending. More information later.

Safety Officer, Scott Bonse, reports that electric and engine powered planes have had some difficulties sharing ground and airspace at Chapin, and need to accommodate each other better, and improve communication, and follow the rules.

The desire for additional starting stands for Chapin and Afton

was also mentioned.

Derby R/C Club is hosting an event on May 18th, at High Park, 79th and Madison, in Derby. More information later.

Break was called, and meeting resumed shortly thereafter with Show and Tell, Raffle and Attendance drawing.

Wes Jordan brought a 24" span Dakota biplane, similar to the one suggested as the Club's "kit" project. He also showed a very large Extra 260 Aeroworks ARF airplane, powered by a DLE 111.

Doug Burrighr brought a Royal Me-109, built from the kit, and powered by an O.S. .15. Also shown by Doug was a scratch-built Attacker, to resurrect an old wing from Midwest Products, that was from an original Attacker, circa 1978. This plane is for his brother, Roger, who owned the Attacker originally, and was not able to fly it, long ago. Power is a blue, O.S. .40 LA. Pictures to follow...
